QEMRF offers a range of grants to support emergency medicine research in Queensland to improve the care of patients and achieve better outcomes for all.

Principal investigators must be working in a Queensland Health or Mater Public Hospital Emergency Department to be eligible for funding, however we encourage multi-disciplinary local, national and international collaboration.

All grants are competitive and will be awarded to the applicants with the highest overall merit in consideration of the five core review criteria below:

1. significance to advancing emergency medicine;
2. investigative team;
3. innovation;
4. the approach including strategy, methodology and analysis; and
5. environment including resources and equipment.

QEMRF Research Funding Schemes:-

1. **Emergency Medicine Trainee Grants.**
Funding is available up to \$20,000.
2. **Emergency Medicine Staff Specialist Grants.**
Funding is available up to \$50,000.
3. **Project Grants.**
Funding of up to \$100,000 per year is available for a maximum of three years.
4. **Program Grants.**
Funding up to \$250,000 per year is available for up to three years.
5. **Leverage Funding.**
Eligible applicants who are making submissions for funding to other funding bodies that meet the objectives of the Foundation, may apply for leverage funding of up to \$50,000 per annum for the term of the grant if it is awarded.
6. **Capacity Building Grants.**
Facilities can apply for a grant to build research capacity within their organisation up to \$70,000 per annum.
7. **Research Fellowship Scheme.**
Provides funds to contribute to the salary costs of an appropriately qualified individual who is seeking to conduct research as part of their clinical position or to work towards a higher degree. There are two levels of fellowships available — short research fellowship and research fellowship. Both are available full or part time up to \$150,000 per annum.
